



Role of Women Entrepreneurs During Lock Down Farah Rizwan, MBAE (2001-2003) Woman Entrepreneur

Apart from individual grievances to several closed and mostly dissolved small and medium badly hurt businesses owned by men, women entrepreneurs came forward and proved their remarkable abilities in the drowning financial circumstances by knitting together cohesive plan through e-commerce. Timely planning and management remained the key to success where people earned millions with their self-driven ambitions of reforming the financial equation, in turn, overcoming the depression, melancholy and down heartedness at an alarming and threatening time of recession.

The pandemic and lockdown has played on the nerves of women entrepreneurs in some form or the other by straining and stretching their already precariously balanced gender role like never before. Nonetheless, in any situation or context they felt that they would always be at their performative best in their multifaceted roles. Women have an art to deal with their own gender in an effective and persuasive manner recognizing the fashion choices from an elderly woman to a young college girl. Female customers are always comfortable with female sellers as compared to male sellers especially in a society where men are always keen to call every elderly woman "Aunty". By the way most women consider it disgusting. Men are actually making it difficult for them and ruining their business while doing this.

It is always important for a woman to look optimistically at everything believing that the world is full of endless opportunities and her contribution to the personal and work front is everlasting, unique and meaningful.
